The saying on one of the tattoos caught my attention - "Faith makes it possible, but not easy." I told her I liked the saying on her tattoo- it was so true. She went on to tell me a couple very tough stories- which is probably why I haven't gotten my thoughts together enough to write the story. Her nephew was killed in a terrible car accident last November and the officials were not able to reach the boy's mom, so called her. They are still dealing with the after affects. The other driver was drunk and the trial is yet to come. And then I found out her dad died of colon cancer at the age of 39 when she was 12. She had not been told he was terminal and didn't know he was dying until it had already happened. Sad, sad stories. It was an honor to be able to lift her and her family up in prayer. She is looking forward to seeing her nephew again in heaven someday. Praise God.

Some of the other comments I heard- one gal who spoke very little English held up her red, fancy shoes she'd gotten and said "Christmas shoes!" She was very excited. One gal I worked with goes to a Lutheran church. She speaks very little English. She was so happy to have me pray with her. The entire time I prayed she was praying in Spanish. :) One gal I worked with looked to be maybe 25. I asked her if she had any kids. She has 4. I asked her if they were in the provided child care area - No, they are all in foster care. Wow. That is a tough life! Thanks for the opportunity to share."

\*One women thought she was of no value to the mission of her church...that the church had no use for her...This lady is now delighted to be making quilts for the "Welcome Baby Basket" ministry.

We were looking for possible venues where we could hold our God in Shoes events, when we came upon the Argentine Community Center. It was a beautiful facility, but when they gave me the papers to fill out spelling out that the cost would be around \$75 an hour, I realized that it would cost us \$1950.00 for the time we would need it, and our budget was small. I said a quick prayer and told the lady, "Our programs are run on donations and volunteers and all of the programs and services we do are totally free to the community. Anything we don't have to pay for a venue will go directly into programs and services for the community." She met with her supervisors and when she got back with me she reported that they were going to give it to us for FREE! :-) PTL! What a wonderful gift!

When we realized that we would be able to use this beautiful facility, the managers asked us if we could do something with health education since Wyandotte County has a huge health initiative going. Well, I said I think we could do that! :-) So, I began thinking about some possible ways we could bring in the topic of health. One way was to include the "Children's Health Expo" and a "Health Screenings Tent" at our Family Fun Day. We didn't have the money to do that as it would cost around \$2000.00 for the programs and supplies. I thought that maybe Shawnee Mission Health would perhaps be interested in partnering with us since the program would take place in Kansas City and it would teach healthful living in children and adults. Well, long story short, Shawnee Mission Health was willing to make the donation and this made it possible to provide the Children's Health Expo with 8 interactive stations on the 8 laws of health where kids learn healthy living through fun games and activities and the Health Screenings Tent where 5 nurses did blood pressure testing and nurses also used basic information people gave them about their age, gender, height, weight and health habits to determine how old their body actually was depending on how many good health habits they did. What a blessing to be able to provide this type of education to the community! Thank You! Shawnee Mission Health.

The last station in our Children's Health Expo is one that emphasizes the importance of healthy thoughts to promote a healthy body...that Trusting in God can actually help us be healthier! As I reflected on this concept, I realized that you can't "Trust" someone you don't know and what better way to get to know God than to read about Him in the Bible! I thought, wouldn't it be wonderful to give an International Children's Bible (ICB) which is written on a third grade reading level to every child who comes through the expo! But these Bibles are \$14.25 each. I had no idea how many would come through the expo, but I knew in the past there was the potential for hundreds to come through. I prayed

about it and asked God if He wanted me to have the Bibles that He would need to supply the funds. One person I contacted, didn't respond at all, and yet I didn't have any other idea as to what to do if we didn't give Bibles. I knew it would take at least one week from the time of the order to actually receive them and time was running out! I was actually out of town and just a few days before it would be too late to order I got a phone call from a lady who had never called me before. She wanted to know more about God in Shoes and wanted to promote it in her church. I was impressed to mention the need for funds for the Children's Bibles. After the weekend we talked again and she said she would be able to give \$2000.00 for the Bibles - 133 beautiful, hardback, third grade reading level Bibles! PTL! Inside each Bible given we placed the following label which reads:

"Dear Friend, We invite you to get to know our best friend, Jesus! That's why we are giving you this Bible. We hope you will read it and get to love Jesus like we do because He is awesome and will be your BEST Friend for life! Check out the link below for a set of free Bible studies for kids. "The week following our God in Shoes Ministry in Scottsbluff, NE Ron and I were back in Scottsbluff, NE for our annual Conference Panhandle Camp Meeting. As we were checking into our hotel, the clerk asked if we were part of the wedding that was happening. Ron said, "No, we are with the Seventh-day Adventist Church." At that the clerk's face lit up and she said, "Oh, you're the ones who do "God in Shoes! That's so awesome! My girlfriend went to that and she said it was like being in heaven! I would have taken the day off and gone, but I didn't know soon enough! "

Another community lady commenting on the Ladies' Free Spa day said, "What kind of church does this for their community?!"

When gathering shoes in Scottsbluff, Pastor Ken Maldonado and his wife Loretta contacted the local PayLess Shoes Store. They quickly found out that chain stores are prohibited to make donations to religious programs, but the lady who worked there said, "I would like to make a personal donation." Weeks went by and Pastor Ken contacted the lady at the store to see if she was still interested in helping. Her answer was, "Yes, but you are going to need a bigger vehicle!" "Why?" "Because I am going to donate 50 pairs of shoes! I have not been to church in years and I just want to do this!" She somehow saw her connection with this program as her connection with God!

God in Shoe's was a fun way to give back to the community. I personally preformed services for <25 ladies on spa day, none of them had ever had a facial before. **One lady said, "This is a once in a life time experience** for me!" Many others expressed appreciation. Several showed true awe that a church family would reach out! One client I worked on is taking a sociology class at Johnson County College... she was fascinated by the loving care given by the staff and the remarkable attitude of the spa dynamics. Her comments of bewilderment seemed to portray that this was a very unusual scene in her life. She is Catholic, and was very happy to have me pray with her. I prayed with many of the clients. One lady in particular requested I pray she find a church family.

One grandma aged lady told me she loved the new shoes. The pair she wore were her only pair, she said. A teen girl was ecstatic to have a pair of shoes which she planned to wear for her senior pictures the next day. Another lady said she needed to buy new shoes for the winter and her son also needed new shoes. She bought him shoes but didn't have money to buy herself any... she was so happy to show me the boots she had chosen!

On my way out the door (when the event was over) I encountered a lady who had come to all the events and seminars. She was thrilled and asked when we might do it again. She expressed that she'd found a "family" with us.

The children enjoyed their time with us in the child care. Several children even attended without their parents present.

We may not see an immediate effect or membership influx from this event... but the attitude of caring will stick with these individuals for sure. Having God in Shoes in a bigger city may not have the same effects on residual church affiliation or follow up contact as a smaller town/city, but caring for others was rewarding!

"I am a senior from the local Adventist school. Our bible class was asked to help with the children's health expo on the family fun day part of God In Shoes. This consisted of eight stations, and at the last one all the kids received a Bible. I was working at the first station, and even there I was amazed at how much some of the people wanted Bibles. I remember there was one parent who came through with her kids, and wanted to make sure that her kids would get Bibles. At the very first station, she told her kids that they should pay attention so they could get Bibles so she could read to them from the Bible. This was very surprising to me, as I have always grown up with multiple Bibles in my house. When she said this, it really hit me that not everyone has the privilege of having multiple translations of the Bible always available to them. I was so glad that I could be a part of helping these children get a Bible so they could know Jesus too. I honestly left wondering if I was more blessed than the families that I was supposed to be serving."

"These Bibles that we gave them are great for children. They are at a third grade reading level, so the kids can understand them. I had the very same translation when I was kid, and sometimes I still like to read from it for its clarity and ease of language. It makes me happy that these kids will be getting such a usable translation."

We were in Kansas City at the Family Fun Day. Part of my interaction with the kids while they were waiting for me to make them balloon animals was to ask them about their day. I would say things like, "so, have you eaten some watermelon? Gone in the bounce house? Gotten your face painted? Played the games?" etc. Another question I would ask was "What is the best part of this day for you?" There was a group of 4 girls in the 9-12 year old range that came to my pink tent. I asked them "what was the best thing you have done today?" The first girl said "the bounce house". The next girl said "the face painting"; the third girl "didn't know"; the fourth girl said "the health stations, because I got my first very own Bible." As ladies are given facials, manicures and massages, they relax and start talking about the challenges in their lives. It is the most natural thing ever to simply ask, "Would you mind if I prayed with you about the things you just shared with me?" The whole spa becomes a house of prayer. The "Surprised by Love" book by Elizabeth Talbot is given to each lady in her spa bag. This is a book that presents the gospel through the eyes of a parent. Inside the book is a tag that reads: "Dear Friend, This book is given with love to you from the "God in Shoes Ministry" and your friends in the \_\_\_\_\_\_ Seventh-day Adventist Churches. If you need someone to talk to, or if we can help you in some way, please give us a call. Please know you are welcome in our churches any time and we would love to get better acquainted with you. "May the Lord bless you and keep you..." Numbers 6:24. Then we list the names and phone numbers of the area pastors and the church addresses.

"I experienced God using me in miraculous ways. He told me to put the information on Craigslist.com and then people were saying they heard about GIS from Craigslist. God told me to ask Teresa about the 2000 flyers and then her boss donated the materials and stopped all production to complete our order. He told me to pray over a woman that was terminal with cancer and she cried and said she had not felt this good in months. He gave me words to speak to a woman that is without a car, without electricity, without water and soon to be evicted from her home. I came into more contact with women that have never had a massage before and they felt the impact of a nurturing touch. (Many shared they were abused).

### \*Ongoing community connections...

The God in Shoes Ministry is meant to be a starting point for local churches to catch the vision for what they can continue to do in their own local communities long after the original "God in Shoes" program has finished. At the end of each "God in Shoes" program, a list of "God in Shoes" Resources are given to our guests spelling out what seminars, kids' programs, bible studies, etc. are available for them to come to in the local churches. A list of all the contact information we receive from our guests when they register at the various programs is given to all area pastors so they can continue to minister to these people.

The Scottsbluff area churches have continued their "God in Shoes" type community outreach by having their own "Family Fun Day" this past September. They are planning their own "Ladies' Free Spa Day" in January and have planned a health expo event in the spring. Pastor Ken continues contacts with people who attended the original "God in Shoes" and has Bible studies resulting from that.

With our "Welcome Baby Gift Baskets" that are given each evening at our Suppers and Seminars to mothers with infants, a friend is also given! The church mother in the congregation and the community mother trade phone numbers and the church mom is given the task of staying in contact with the community mother by calling her to encourage her, be a listening ear, and give her information that would be helpful to her in her role as a parent. She would also invite to bring her to her church's Moms group to make some friends, get diapers and be given helpful information as tools for her to be a better mom.

#### \*This ministry works cross-culturally...

At our Lincoln, Nebraska Family Fun Day one young mother told me that she was from Northern Iraq and the children she had with her had fled from the genocide happening there from Isis. She was bringing them to the Family Fun Day to help them forget the horrific things they had experienced!

"Maria and I visited that Iraqi family for a good while. They are Yazidis, of which Lincoln holds the highest population in the U.S. We hope to share a meal with them soon..." Pastor John Abbott – referring to the two Northern Iraq women and their families.

All of our seminars are presented in English, but we have someone provide simultaneously translation through individual headsets during the seminars. Handouts and books are given out in English and Spanish as well. It has been great to work together as each person sees the importance of the various gifts.

We pair up English and Spanish-speaking people to go to the community to survey the communities' felt needs and also to go back to the same area with invitations to the events. Upon returning from our survey in Wichita, one English-speaking man who had been paired up with a Spanish-speaking person said, "Whoever decided this was brilliant! We would go to the door and one of us would be speaking... the person at the door would have a 'blank look' on their face and the other person would start talking and all of a sudden their face would light up and we could get the message across. It worked perfectly!"
